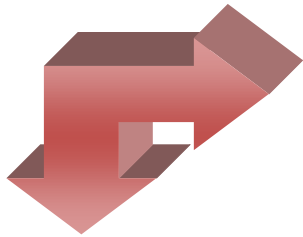

April in the Bee Yard



On a warm, sunny day with calm winds, the following items should be checked during the month of April:

- 1) **Evaluation of Food Stores:** Make sure they have at least 15 pounds of honey in storage. If they do not have adequate food storage, begin feeding them sugar syrup (for spring, mix one part sugar and one part hot tap water).

- 2) **Remove any chemical treatments for mites:** By April you should have already treated for mites. Remove all treatment applications before putting supers on top.
- 3) **Make sure your bees have room to grow:** The colony is beginning to grow in size and number of bees. Allow for adequate room for their growth to reduce crowding in the brood nest which increases the chance of swarming.

After the following checks have been completed, your next goal is to continue to make sure your hive is strong and ready for the honey flow. See the chart below for plants that are in bloom around the piedmont area during April.
