

## **Honey Extraction Demo - Ron Nickels**

WCBA member Ron Nickels led a hands on honey extraction demo at the June meeting. Several tips and photos are below:

 Pull frames or full supers that are ready to extract.



Make sure you have all the necessary equipment to begin extracting.
 Equipment needed includes an extractor, some form of uncapping tank, strainers, a means of filtering the honey, uncapping knife, buckets and maybe even a settling tank. The extracting room and all of the equipment should be ready and clean prior to actually removing the honey.





 You may use an uncapping knife or a scratching tool to remove the cappings off the frame. When using the uncapping knife hold the frame at an angle and cut in a downward motion.



- Have an uncapping tank or a Rubbermaid container to catch the cappings. You may strain the cappings after extracting honey and melt the wax down to make candles.
- Put the uncapped frames into the extractor and spin the frames for about a minute or until the honey is spun off the frame. Flip the frames around in the extractor and spin the other side.

## July in the Bee Yard



During the month of July you may consider extracting honey if you did not do so in June.

When extracting honey make sure you have all the proper equipment needed. Bottles and labels are just the start of equipment needed.

The WCBA has extracting equipment available for members

to borrow. Please return all borrowed equipment to the WCBA clean.

When pulling supers to extract be sure to leave one full super for your bees to eat off of. In the Piedmont region many nectar bearing plants for bees are currently out of bloom.

After extracting place all extracted frames and supers on your stronger colonies for them to begin working again. Check mite population in your hives and consider treating in late July or early August after you have extracted for the season.
